



MATHS

In Maths, children will begin initially on fluency with numbers to 10. They will learn to count forwards and backwards from any given number up to 10, including reading and writing in numerals and words. The children will identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations. Later in the term, children will move on to representing and using number bonds within 10 to add and subtract one-digit numbers. This will include finding the difference between numbers. Later on, children will be learning to recognise and name common 2-D and 3-D shapes.

ENGLISH

This term the children will continue to work through the Read, Write, Inc phonics programme. Year 1 will study texts related to our topics, including Leo and the Octopus, The Princess & the White Bear King and Halibut Jackson. They will continue to develop their ability to write meaningful sentences, with capital letters and simple punctuation, for a range of purposes. Children will focus on letter formation and size in Handwriting.



SCIENCE

Early this term, children will learn about the parts of the human body and about each of the senses.

Later they will be learning about materials. The children will be identifying and naming a variety of common materials and exploring their properties. They will start to develop some scientific skills such as observing and asking questions.



COMPUTING

This term, children will use Purple Mash software to learn about basic online safety such as passwords. They will also use learn to use a computer for sorting and grouping.

ITALIAN

Ciao

This term the children will cover units called In the Jungle and the Circus. Children will learn key words and phrases



HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

This term, children will be introduced to the history and how we learn about the past. They will learn about their families and some family history including looking at where in the world their families come from. Later we will look at royalty and learn about the British royal family. Our geography theme this term is weather with a focus on Autumn and Winter.

MUSIC

The children will continue to have music lessons with our specialist music teacher Mrs Shanahan. She will focus on teaching the children songs linked to their topic and skills necessary for percussion instruments.

PE

The Children will have outdoor PE lessons to develop their games skills and to build stamina and keep healthy. During indoor PE children will have fitness and gymnastic lessons. The children will learn to travel in a variety of ways and to control a ball.

RE & RSE

This term we will be looking at the theme of family and how God loves and cares for every family. We will also look at Belonging and how baptism is an invitation to belong to God's family. Waiting is our theme in Advent as we wait for Jesus' birth. Through story times and assemblies children will explore ways of giving, being thankful for everything that we have and the importance of community.

ART & DT

This term the children will explore a range of materials and techniques to produce work related to our topics e.g. printing. They will develop observational skills through self-portraits and looking at plants and insects. Later they will create crowns from around the world. They will be encouraged to explore colour, texture, pattern and line.





MATHS

The children will continue using the White Rose Maths scheme. They will use their knowledge of number to 10, to progress to adding and subtracting within 20. They will also develop place value with numbers to 50. They will solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction. Later in term, the children will begin to count in multiples of twos, fives and tens. They will explore a range of measurement, including length, height, weight and volume.



ENGLISH

This term the children will continue to develop their phonics and reading skills through the Read, Write, Inc programme. They will learn grammar and spelling, and to develop comprehension skills through texts, including 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donaldson, versions of Goldilocks, 'The Lonely Beast' by Chris Judge, 'Ning and the Night Spirits' and 'Meerkat Mail' by Emily Gravett. They will continue to develop their ability to write meaningful sentences, with capital letters and simple punctuation, for a range of purposes.



SCIENCE

This term, the children will continue to observe changes across the four seasons and describe weather associated with Winter and Spring. In their topic on 'Animals', they will learn about how animals can be grouped and to identify common features of animals belonging to each group. Later they will explore ways we care for our planet and why it is important. They will also begin to look at planting and how to help plants to grow.



COMPUTING

This term, children will use Purple Mash software to learn about the basic keyboard skills through a unit called Pictograms. They will also begin to look at coding and robots during a unit called Lego Builders.



HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

The children will learn about the seven continents and learn to identify these. They will learn about China and be able to locate this on a map. They will develop their understanding of maps and locating places through a unit called Spatial Sense.

ITALIAN

Ciao

This term the children will cover units called Minbeasts and In My Town. Children will learn key words and phrases

MUSIC

The children will continue to have music lessons with our specialist music teacher Mrs Shanahan. She will focus on teaching the children songs linked to their topic and skills necessary for percussion instruments.



PE

The Children will have outdoor PE lessons to develop their games skills and to build stamina and keep healthy. They will focus on basketball and gain basic orienteering skills. During indoor PE children will explore movement and dance, as well as take part in volleyball lessons. The children will learn to travel in a variety of ways and to sequence movements.



RE & RSE

This term we will be thinking about special people and special meals, including the Last Supper. We will also be focusing on Change, leading up to Lent and Easter and reading related stories.

Through story times and assemblies children will explore ways of giving, being thankful for everything that they have and the importance of community.



ART & DT

This term the children will continue to explore a range of mediums with a focus on watercolour. They will use paint to explore the willow tree pattern story and to produce cherry blossom scrolls. They will learn about the artist Etel Adnan and her work using print. When painting and collaging, the children will also use their knowledge of the seasons to inspire their work.





MATHS

This term children will be starting with a focus on multiplication and division. They will be learning to count in 2s, 5s, and 10s and learning how to count in equal groups. Then they will move on to recognising a half and a quarter in their fractions work. They will learn to describe positions and directions. In the second half of the term, children will be continuing to develop their number fluency with a focus on place value within 100. They will also move on to a unit about measurements, looking specifically at money and time. Children will be learning the days of the week, months of the year and how the clock represents hours, minutes and seconds.



ENGLISH

This term the children will be reading a great range of books, including: 'Where the Wild Things Are', 'The Owl and the Pussycat', 'Secret of Black Rock' and 'How to Find Gold'. Using these texts as inspiration, children will be learning to write narratives, poetry, information texts, instructions and letters. They will focus on some key writing skills including: using conjunctions and, but and or; using capital letters and full stops; using capitals for names of places and people; using adjectives to describe; and spelling a range of plurals.



SCIENCE

This term, the children will be learning about plants. They will be learning to identify the different parts of plants and will be exploring their local area to look for deciduous and evergreen trees.

Later in the term, the children will be looking at seasonal changes with a particular focus on changes in the summer.



COMPUTING

This term, children will be learning what coding is and how to use design mode to create blocks of code. They will write program to control how a characters moves on their screen. Later in the term, they will learn to use spreadsheets to organise data.

GEOGRAPHY

In Geography, children will be learning about the seven continents. They will be learning to mark them on a map of the world and they will also learn about the North and South Poles and the Equator. They will then focus on Europe and the UK later in the term. They will learn about the countries that make up the United Kingdom.



ITALIAN

Ciao

This term children will be working through a unit titled 'Loretta & Teddy Bear'. This unit focuses on a Teddy Bears' Picnic theme, aiming to expose the children to vocabulary for: picnic, forest, sandwich, uice, and hide & seek.

MUSIC

The children will continue to have music lessons with our specialist music teacher Mrs Shanahan. She will focus on teaching the children songs linked to their topic and skills necessary for percussion instruments.

PE

During Indoor PE lessons, children will be working through a dance unit focusing on joining simple actions and positions together in unison. In gymnastics, they will learn different balances and ways to jump and land safely. In Outdoor PE, children will have Hockey and Athletics sessions.



RE & RHE

This term, the topic is 'To the Ends of the Earth'. In this unit, the children will be learning about the Ascension and Pentecost. Children will then look at the importance of different symbols in Christianity, Judaism and Islam.

In RHE, the children will be learning about living in community with others and how we should treat our neighbours.



ART & DT

This term the children will be using spirals in their drawings. They will be making sketchbooks and using these for observational drawings.

Next half term, they will move on to simple print making. They will use their hands, feet and flowers to explore the concept of print making. They will then move on to relief printing.
